- Asarum canadense

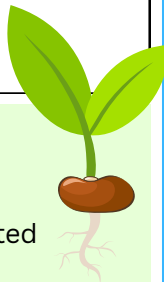
## Notes

- Growth habit: compact/clumping
- Attracts beneficial insects
- Thrives in sandy or loamy, well drained soil
- Cut back flowering stems after blooming to promote regrowth, but leave some so they will go to seed

## Propagation Information

- Seeds required 60-day cold stratification (according to some sources), however, I have germinated seeds in a warm location in 14-21 days without stratification
- Blooms in 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- Self-seeds readily
