- Liatris spicata

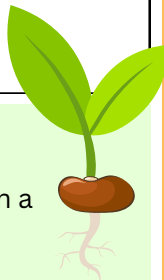
Notes

- Growth habit: upright/spreading
- Must be watered consistently during the first 2 years to help individuals establish drought-resistance
- Attracts beneficial insects
- Supports native butterflies and bees at risk including Bombus Vagans
- If grown in containers, make sure it's big enough to allow roots to grow

Caterpillar/Moth Host Plant	Provides Nest Site/ Nest Materials	Hummingbird Favorite	
Container Friendly	Preferred by imperiled native bees and butterflies	Recommended by Xerces Society	
Rabbits may eat plant when young	Deer Resistant	Drought Tolerant	

Propagation Information

- Seeds require 30-day cold stratification before germinating in a warm location
- Bloom year: 2nd or 3rd
- It slowly self-seeds and spreads by rhizomes
- Propagate by cuttings and by division in late spring
