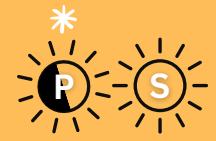

- Lobelia siphilitica
- Rudbeckia lacinata

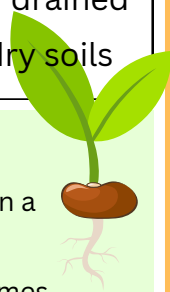
Notes

- Native to MA and New England
- Growth habit:
upright/clumping/vase-shaped
- Can be pinched at the beginning of June to make the plant have stocky, shorter and sturdier stems
- Low-maintenance
- Supports native butterflies and bees including Bombus Vagans
- Prefers organic/fertile, well-drained soils -ilt does not tolerate dry soils

Propagation Information

- Seeds require 30-day cold stratification before germinating in a warm location
- Blooms in 2nd year
- It self-seeds and spreads by rhizomes slowly?
- Propagate by cuttings and division in spring or fall
