Family: Hypericaceae/ST. John's Wort

### Garden Companions

- Rudbeckia spp.
- Native grasses

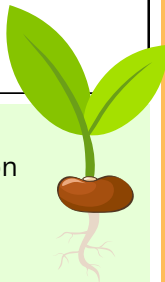
### Notes

- Growth habit: mounded
- Native to other parts of New England
- Thrives in sandy, well-drained soils
- Slow-growing shrub
- Attracts bees & butterflies
- Provides shelter for birds
- Rejuvenate older plants with a light crown trimming in winter
- Low maintenance
- Good for erosion control
- Supports native bees at risk including Bombus Vagans

### Propagation Information

- Seeds germinate in a warm location without pre-treatment
- Blooms in 3<sup>rd</sup> year
- Self-seeds at a medium pace and spreads by rhizomes slowly
- Propagate by softwood cuttings
