## Garden Companions

- Plants that do well in poor or rocky soils

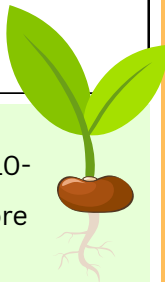
## Notes

- Growth habit: upright/stiff stems
- As a legume, it helps fix nitrogen in the soil
- Attracts beneficial insects
- Performs best in full sun
- Rabbits and deer often will nibble

 Cape Cod Native	 Blooms August to September	 Recommended by Xerces Society
 Caterpillar/Moth Host Plant	 Provides Bird Seeds/Fruit	
 Container Friendly	 Drought Tolerant	

## Propagation Information

- Seeds require scarification and a 10-day cold stratification period before germinating in a warm location
- Blooms in 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- Self-seeds at a medium rate
