- Asclepias tuberosa
- Rudbeckia hirta

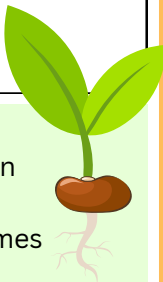
Notes

- Native to New England and and Ecoregion (84)
- Growth habit: spreading/suckering
- Low-maintenance
- Attracts butterflies, bees, songbirds, and other pollinators/wildlife
- Prefers poor soils

 NOT Native to Cape Cod	 Blooms July to September
 Pollinator Magnet	 Caterpillar/Moth Host Plant
	 Container Friendly
 Rabbit Resistant	 Deer Resistant
 Drought Tolerant	 Salt Tolerant

Propagation Information

- Seeds germinate in a warm location without pre-treatment (easy!)
- It self-seeds and spreads by rhizomes slowly
- Propagate by cuttings
- Propagate by division in early spring through early summer
