- Geranium maculatum
- Conoclinium coelestinum
- Tiarella cordifolia
- Phlox divaricata

Notes

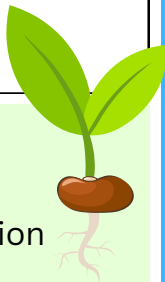
- Native to US
- Growth habit: clumping/suckering
- Attracts bees and other pollinators/wildlife
- The initial growth, which reaches 12", can be cut back after seeding to stimulate new growth
- Very humid conditions can bring on leaf spot fungal diseases or powdery mildew
- Control powdery mildew by keeping foliage dry (water ground, not leaves) and removing afflicted leaves
- Thrives in filtered sun

Propagation Information

- Seeds require 60-day cold stratification before germinating in a warm location
- Blooms in year 1 or 2
- Self-seeds and spreads by rhizomes slowly
- Propagate by division in early spring/late summer
