- Eutrochium dubium

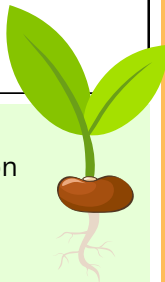
Notes

- Growth habit: upright/spreading
- Fast growing perennial
- Tough plant!
- Pollinator magnet - makes copious amounts of nectar!
- Easy to transplant

Propagation Information

- Seeds germinate in a warm location without pre-treatment
- Bloom year: maybe 1st, likely 2nd
- Easy to propagate by cutting and division any time during growing season
- Spreads by rhizomes at a medium pace, so it's easy to control if desired
