- Solidago nemoralis
- Symphyotrichum spp.

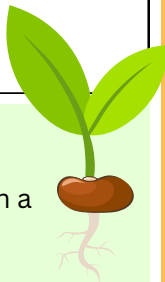
## Notes

- Growth habit: clumping
- Provides important nectar and pollen for native bees
- Attracts birds, ladybugs, lacewings and other beneficial insects
- Well-behaved Solidago
- Supports native butterflies at risk

## Propagation Information

- Seeds require 60-day cold stratification before germinating in a warm location
- Blooms in 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- It self seeds at a medium pace and spreads slowly by rhizomes
- Propagate by division every 2-3 years in spring or fall
